- Lewis Squires of Crystal View Drive, Scottville, indicated he was pleased with the August Primary election results and was looking forward to working with the County Board again.
- Patsy Hagerman of the City of Ludington is the Mason County representative on the Area Agency on Aging Board of Directors. She thanked the Commissioners for their continued support but addressed several areas of concern including: expanding Ludington Mass Transit/Dial-a-Ride to all townships to enable the elderly to get to doctor appointments, and the fact that phone companies can discontinue land line service starting January 1, 2017 and this will be a concern for the elderly in areas of the county that receive poor cell reception.

The July 2016 Treasurer's Report was distributed. Treasurer Kmetz was not present at the meeting due to attending the Michigan Association of County Treasurer's Conference in Marquette, Michigan.

The July 2016 Clerk's Report was distributed. Chief Deputy Clerk Debra Purtee reported that the August 2, 2016 Primary Election went extremely well even though there was low voter turnout at 20.90% as compared to August of 2012 at 32.94%. Canvass of the election has been completed by the Canvass Board and results have been submitted to the State.

Chief Deputy Clerk Purtee gave an update on new election equipment. Three companies were given the bid by the State regarding the new election equipment: ES & S, Hart, and Dominion. It is Clerk Kelly's intention to have product demonstrations soon with the local clerks. All are invited to attend the demonstration. Please let Clerk Kelly know if you wish to attend. The cost for equipment is still fluctuating as it was at \$1,000 per precinct and now the state has raised that to \$2,000 contribution from each precinct. Clerk Kelly will continue to monitor the situation and keep the Commissioners informed.

County Administrator Knizacky stated that final budget requests for 2017 are due by September 1st and if Commissioners have input, they should contact the administrator or one of the members of the Finance, Personnel, & Rules Committee. He stated that the increase in the consumers price index cap for property taxes is currently 0.9%.

At the last Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority (MMRMA) board meeting they voted to increase cyber security coverage from \$1 million to \$5 million, but not increase the premiums which will benefit Mason County.

Commissioner Posma reported that the Finance, Personnel, & Rules Committee gave approval for the administrator to send a letter of interest for re-election to his position on the MMRMA Board of Directors.

Commissioner Posma thanked the Administrator Knizacky, all department heads and elected officials for the work they do to keep the County's in a positive fiscal position.
