Public comment: D'Ann Roher, 4-H International Programs Coordinator for the State of Michigan, reviewed the International Exchange Program and explained how the program is set up between Mason County and Japan/Korea and the opportunities it allows for participants on a national level. The 4-H International Exchange Program had several group members and host families in attendance and each introduced themselves and stated where they were from.

Michigan State University Extension (MSUE) District 5 Coordinator Mike Krauch presented his annual report. Highlights for MSUE include their recent move to the West Shore Community College Campus. This relocation promotes collaboration between MSUE and West Shore Community College, provides access to state of the art technology and facilities, and an improved physical plant, as well as assists in cooperation and collaboration with the local Future Farmers of America (FFA) and the Michigan State University Institute of Agriculture Technology Programs. Director Krauch touched on several programs offered by MSUE: Economic Development through the LEAD (Leaders in Economic Alliance Development) Program; Enviroweather Weather Data and Pest Modeling; Sea Grant Programs; Health & Nutrition; Mason County Agriculture; 4-H Tech Wizards Youth Mentoring Program; and the 4-H Club Program. Director Krauch thanked Commissioners Andersen and Taranko for attending the open house and former Commissioner Carpenter for his past work with the 4-H Programs.
