- 1. The following proposition shall be submitted to the electors of the County at the November 6, 2018, Election:

OAKVIEW MEDICAL CARE FACILITY MILLAGE RENEWAL

This proposal is for the reauthorization of a millage, which expired with the 2017 tax levy.

Shall the limitation on taxes which may be assessed against all taxable real and personal property in Mason County be increased by not more than .9715 mill (\$0.9715 on each \$1,000.00 of taxable value) for a period of ten (10) years, December 1, 2018, to November 30, 2028, inclusive, to provide funds for the operation, maintenance and capital costs of the Oakview Medical Care Facility and shall Mason County levy the millage for this purpose thereby raising an estimated \$1,826,882 in the first year of the levy?

WHEREAS, week two focuses on Learning Life Saving Skills by knowing basic home maintenance like how to turn off gas utilities and installing smoke and carbon monoxide detectors on every floor; and

WHEREAS, week three concentrates on Checking Your Insurance Coverage and preparing by snapping photos of important documents and belongings to help quickly file a claim after a disaster; and

WHEREAS, week four urges everyone to complete an Emergency Financial First Aid Kit (EFFAK) to know how to preserve important documents and how much money to have on hand for lodging, food, and gas after a disaster; and

WHEREAS, the devastating hurricanes, floods, and wildfires of 2017 and the first half of 2018 reminded us of the importance of preparing for disasters. WHEREAS, the United States Constitution and the amendments hereto, as well as the Michigan Constitution provide that people charged with criminal offenses are entitled the right to have an attorney represent them in court proceedings; and

WHEREAS, the judicial system recognizes the rights of persons without the ability to pay for an attorney and/or other legal services (such as hiring investigators or expert witnesses) have the same right of legal representation in the court system as a person who can afford to pay for an attorney and/or other legal services; and

WHEREAS, the State of Michigan ("State") has created the Michigan Indigent Defense Commission ("MIDC") within the Department of Licensing and Regulation; and

WHEREAS, the MIDC is purposed with creating more effective and equitable funding at the State and local level for persons who are charged with criminal offenses and do not have the financial ability to pay for an attorney and/or other legal services; and

WHEREAS, the State, through the MIDC, is separating the financial matters of court appointed cases away from the court system to local court funding units (i.e., in this case, the County of Mason on behalf of the 79th District Court and the 51st Circuit Court), which requires creation of a separate fund within the local chart of accounts; and

WHEREAS, the MIDC is receiving grant applications to fund court-appointed attorney and related legal services from local court funding units to provide funding by the State to the local court funding units beginning October 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the MIDC allows for grant applications to request funds for limited construction costs to allow for criminal defense attorneys and their clients to meet in a private and secure setting at or near a courtroom, in furtherance of protecting attorney-client confidentially; and

WHEREAS, this new fund within the local chart of accounts will accept all funds from the State through MIDC grants and will charge all MIDC-related costs to this fund; and

WHEREAS, the MIDC recommends any fund balance at the end of the County's fiscal year should remain in the newly created fund and not revert to the County's general fund so that funds are used exclusively for court appointed attorney and related legal services; and

WHEREAS, the MIDC recommends any fund balance at the end of the County's fiscal year shall remain in the fund to carryover to the next year to be used for future compliance expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the County acknowledges that a separate fund will allow for better management of the grant funds and monitoring by the local and state interested parties; and

WHEREAS, the Mason County Board of Commissioners determines that this is an important service and source of funding for defendants in criminal cases who do not have the ability to afford an attorney or legal services in the 79th District Court and the 51st Circuit Court.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mason County Board of Commissioners hereby resolves that the Mason County Treasurer's Office shall create a separate fund within the local chart of accounts to accept all funds from the State through MIDC grants and to charge all MIDC-related costs to this fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all funds received through the MIDC grants will be placed in this fund and all MIDC-related costs shall be charged to this fund; any fund balance at the end of the County's fiscal year will remain in the fund and carryover to the next year to be used for future compliance expenditures.
