The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room located in the Mason County Courthouse in the City of Ludington.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lange.

Roll call was taken. Present: J. Lenius, B. Carpenter, C. Lange, C. VanderWall, M. Nichols, J. Andersen, T. Posma Absent: None.

Invocation was given by T. Posma. Pledge to the flag followed.

Motion by C. VanderWall and seconded by J. Lenius to approve the agenda with the addition of a resolution and a public hearing regarding Mason County applying for \$175,000 of FY2012 Michigan State Housing Development Authority's Housing Resource Fund. Motion carried.

Motion by J. Lenius and seconded by J. Andersen to approve the minutes of the June 11, 2013 regular meeting. Motion carried.

### Public Comment:

• Consumers Energy Communications Director for the Lakewinds Energy Park Dennis Marvin introduced Eric Gustad who has recently been hired by Consumers Energy to be the Public Relations Area Manager for Mason-Mecosta-Lake and Osceola Counties.

Mason County Road Commission Board Chairman Doug Robidoux reviewed the 2012 report for the Road Commission that was provided in the agenda packet. The board negotiated a three-year contract with union employees in 2012, completed the Lake Wind Farm road use agreement, and continued work on the Primary Road System as well as the Local Road System (through contract cost-sharing with the townships). The 2013 budget is \$8.6 million compared to \$9.2 in 2012. Commissioner Andersen expressed concern regarding the lack of communication by the Road Commission to township officials. Chairman Robidoux stated that has been an issue and a new form is being considered that would provide documentation of not only contacting individuals in following up on concerns but also contacting township supervisors as part of the process in order to communicate what can be done regarding the concerns of their residents. Chairman Robidoux also asked the County Board to encourage residents who have concerns to contact the Road Commission directly as many times complaints are being aired to the county or township boards and not to the Road Commission.

Motion by Commissioner Carpenter and seconded by Commissioner Posma to suspend the regular meeting in order to hold a public hearing regarding Mason County applying for \$175,000 of FY2012 Michigan State Housing Development Authority's Housing Resource Fund. Motion carried.

Administrator Knizacky gave a brief overview of the history regarding Mason County's involvement in this program since 1992. The County has applications that were not completed under the last grant which indicates the need to pursue additional funding. The \$175,000 in grant funds for the program is passed down from the federal government through the state government in order to help rehabilitate homes for low or very low income residents in the County of Mason. The deferred no interest loan gives the homeowner an opportunity to rehabilitate their home without requiring repayment of the loan until they sell their home. Repayment funds are put back in to the program in order to rehabilitate additional homes that qualify for the program. It was also explained through a series of questions that this will be the 11<sup>th</sup> Grant Mason County will be applying for through the program and the first time it will require the county to spend 50% within a "targeted area" in the county and the remaining 50% to be used anywhere in the county. The State of Michigan will provide a consultant to identify the "targeted area" within the county. It was also noted that any repaid loan money above a balance of \$5,000 must be utilized within the program prior to using any new grant dollars. The application will be submitted on July 19, 2013.

With no further questions a motion was made by Commissioner Andersen and seconded by Commissioner Nichols to close the public hearing and resume the regular meeting. Motion carried.

Mason-Lake Conservation District Administrator and MAEAP Tech Jordan DeVries joined the meeting and gave a report on his first year with the Mason-Lake Conservation District. Mr. DeVries stated that the district expects to complete 13 Groundwater Certifications, will hold a farm tour in September, and shipped over 100,000 plants of Beach Grass to the east coast in helping to stabilize the coastline after Hurricane Sandy. The District also is working toward a Coastal Water Trail from Ludington State Park to Silver Lake State Park which will also be dealing with some evasive plant species. The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day will take place on August 17, 2013.
