The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners Room located in the Mason County Courthouse in the City of Ludington.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lange.

Correspondence: No correspondence was read.

Public comments: Aldon Maleckas, Custer Township, addressed the board with concerns on the wind turbines causing health issues and pollution including mining for magnets from China.

Zoning and Building Director Mary Reilly reviewed the 2014 Building and Zoning reports which included the Master Plan; Junk Authority; Shadow Flicker Project; Sound Study; Joint Planning with Ludington, Hamlin, Pere Marquette and Mason County; and the recommended priority issues for 2015 for the Planning Commission. Building Department permits were steady with a slight increase over previous years. Revenue increased primarily due to the fee increase that went into effect in February of 2012.

Equalization Director Tom Routhier presented the 2015 Equalization Report. The total State Equalized Value for the county is \$1,970,738,260 and the total Taxable Value is \$1,705,609,433. The overall assessed value for the county increased by 1% and the taxable value grew by 1%. Director Routhier recommended that the Board accept the assessed values as determined by the local assessors and Boards of Review as the County Equalized Values (CEV). The CEV's will be submitted to the State Tax Commission and will be accepted as the State Equalized Values (SEV's) at the final State Equalization on May 26, 2015.

<u>WHEREAS</u>, there were several injuries and three deaths resulting from severe weather in Michigan in 2014; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, our citizens should be aware of the warning signs of severe weather and proper safety and emergency procedures; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, each year the Michigan Committee for Severe Weather Awareness (MCSWA) promotes a Severe Weather Awareness Week to educate the public about the dangers of tornados and other severe weather events and the precautions that can be taken to save lives and protect families.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Mason County urges all county residents to educate themselves and prepare for severe weather and declares April 12 - 18, 2015 as Severe Weather Awareness Week in Mason County.
