The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lange.

Invocation was given by C. VanderWall. Pledge to the flag followed.

Commissioner Lange read a letter received from the US Department of Agriculture inviting Commissioners to an open house for their new office serving the Baldwin/White Cloud area. Dedication ceremony for the building will be 1:00 p.m. on September 21, 2015 at the new District Ranger Station on M-37 in Baldwin.

## **Public Comment:**

- Aldon Malekas of Custer Township voiced his continued concerns with the Wind Turbines especially after reading the editorial in the Ludington Daily News on 8/6/15. He requested compliance be enforced by the Board.
- Evelyn Bergaila of Riverton Township agreed with Mr. Malekas and voiced her concerns regarding the decision making process of the Planning Commission and the Open Meetings Act. She acknowledged additional concerns that have been voiced at Public Hearings involving Agri-Business. She hopes the Board will say "No" to the zoning ordinance amendment to Agri-Business in Mason County.
- Susan Kaiser of Riverton Township has attended the Planning Commission meetings and voiced concerns about the levels exceeding at 45.4 decibels. She also felt they violated the Open Meetings Act.
- Jordan Devries, Mason-Lake Conservation District Administrator, informed the Board that he received a grant for \$424,888 from the National Fish and Wildlife Association to restore the Pere Marquette River. One goal is to restore the levels of Brook Trout and Northern Pike, as well as connectivity throughout the Pere Marquette River. He also reminded everyone that Saturday August 16, 2015 is Hazardous Waste Day.

Michigan State University Extension District #5 Coordinator Michael Krauch wanted to thank board members Curt VanderWall and Bill Carpenter and express his appreciation for their support of the Mason County 4-H Program. He listed various activities that the 4-H program is currently offering and noted the increase in numbers due to the additions of such programs as Tech Wizard and Shooting Sports. He introduced De'Anne Rohr, the new Supervising Educator.

Mason County Road Commission Manager Wayne Schoonover discussed various projects the Mason County Road Commission continues to work on. Two bridge grants were received (for Stephens Road and Decker Road over the South Branch of the Lincoln River) from the Local Bridge Program which is funded through the Federal Highway Administration and the Michigan Department of Transportation. Road funding continues to be a big issue.
