He noted that numbers are currently down at the shelter due to the assistance of the area animal groups, who assist with placement of animals. Additionally, she addressed the new Concealed Pistol License (CPL) legislation currently being considered at the State and noted that even if the legislation changes, Concealed Pistol Licenses will still be available in the County Clerk's office.

Administrator Knizacky reported that the recent County audit went smoothly and he will review the report at the July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting. He reminded the Commissioner's of the upcoming County Alliance meeting and asked to let him or Administrative Assistant Rita know by July 17, 2017 who was planning on attending.

#### Public Comment:

Ray Franz, former 101<sup>st</sup> House State Representative, announced that he has filed for the 35<sup>th</sup> Senate Seat. He gave a brief history of his background accomplishments and his reasoning's for running for this position. He thanked the community for their previous support and asked for continued support as he moved forward.
