November 9, 2021

The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 9:00 a.m. at the Mason County Airport terminal conference room.

The meeting was called to order by Chair J. Andersen

Invocation was given by R. Bacon. Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America followed.

Treasurer A. Kmetz presented the monthly Treasurer's Report. He noted that he will be interviewing three candidates in the first round of interviews and then will have a second round of interviews Monday next week.

Clerk C. Kelly presented the monthly Clerk's Report. Clerk Kelly noted that the Election last Tuesday went very well but had low voter turnout. The road millage request did pass. Payroll has processed seventeen new employees for the 2021 calendar year, along with 16 retirees. In addition, she brought the Commissioner's up-to-date with regards to the Unemployment Insurance Agency issues for 2020 and 2021. The Pandemic raised some issues with regards to claims for unemployment and the Clerk's Office processed 13 protests against unemployment claims for 2021 and 21 protests for unemployment claims in 2020. Three County employees had identity issues and fraudulent claims against them where police reports were filed. In late 2020, Administrator Knizacky, Magistrate Jackson, and Clerk Kelly had a phone-court case in which the County did prevail against an employee who resigned their position that was trying to obtain unemployment benefits against the County. Additionally, in 2021, the Clerk's office has continued to fight fraudulent submitted claims, where the applicant was granted the 52 weeks of unemployment at \$362 a week. This would have resulted in Mason County having to pay \$18,824.00 in unemployment claims in this case and approximately \$2,714.00 in another case.

New staff is learning the Court position at this time. It will be a slow process as we are starting with no experience in the courts, but seeing improvement and understanding of what the job entails every day.

Commissioner Hartley inquired if the Sheriff's Department followed up with the fraud claims and was informed by Clerk Kelly that she has heard nothing further since the police report was filed.

Administrator Knizacky presented the Administrator's Monthly Report. Administrator Knizacky noted that he has received word that the EMPG grant could utilize Covid funds to fully fund this Grant. Additionally, the Court Grant related to COVID expenses was extended. This Grant would allow the County to apply for up to \$75,000.00 in monies, and once the grant is approved after submission, it would be brought back to the Board for approval.

Commissioner Squires inquired about infrastructure grants related to bridges or highways and wanted to know if the Administrator has seen any and was informed no.

Public Comment: Anita Wilson, Pennies from Heaven, thanked Dr. Halladay for his presentation. She noted her foundation can assist with getting a position started, to fund a study, help seniors, and assist if they are able to.

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Other Business: Commissioner Squires thanked Administrator Knizacky for his work with the Sheriff
Department and with the Union Contract noting pro-safety is an important aspect he feels in Mason County.
With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 10:31 A.M.
