The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Room located in the Mason County Courthouse in the City of Ludington.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Lange.

Roll call was taken. Present: J. Lenius, B. Carpenter, C. Lange, C. VanderWall,

M. Nichols, J. Andersen, T. Posma

Absent: None.

Invocation was given by J. Andersen. Pledge to the flag followed.

Motion by T. Posma and seconded by J. Lenius to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Motion by M. Nichols and seconded by J. Andersen to approve the minutes of the May 14, 2013 regular meeting. Motion carried.

There was no Public Comment.

Airport Manager Dave Johnson gave his annual report stating that the airport is following the trend of other general aviation airports nationally with usage being down due to the economy. The airport currently houses 25 aircraft with the student and private activity being less than previous years. "Fractional Share" airplane activity (jets) has been on the increase and Manager Johnson noted this will most-likely continue to increase and cited the recent order by Net Jet for new aircraft as confirmation of this growing trend. The new John Deere 544K loader was purchased and put into service in 2012 as part of the 10-year Capital Layout Plan for the airport. Manager Johnson stated the next major project for the airport will be the construction of a new 6-unit t-hanger and will be completed as funds become available.

Animal Control Officer Marion gave his annual report and stated that euthanizations have showed a slight increase which he felt was in part due to economic conditions. The dog census is continuing on Wednesdays and Thursdays with the result being approximately half the county being done each year. Officer Marion stated that things have gone well in his department over the past year and the animal adoption process with the help of Lakeshore Animal Friends' spay/neuter program continues to be very successful.

Michigan State University Extension (MSUE) District Coordinator Kay Cummings thanked the County Board for their support and reported that after a few initial issues the office location in Scottville is working out nicely. The Mason County 4-H program has been in transition with there being fewer leaders and membership being down slightly, however, those involved are committed and the program seems to have stabilized. Director Cummings proceeded to highlight some of the program activities provided in the annual report in the agenda packet and answered questions.

A general discussion was held regarding the request from Sheriff Cole that had not been discussed at the committee level. Commissioners raised concerns stating the Remote Operating Vehicle may be a better fit for the City of Ludington as Chief Barnett is in charge of the Port Authority, the highly technical piece of equipment would require special electrical needs, as well as the time needed for staffing and training, and the local match money required for the grant was not budgeted. It was pointed out that submitting for the grant did not mean it would be approved. Chairman Lange commended Sheriff Cole for seeking grant money however he felt this particular issue was not in the best interest of the Mason County taxpayers.

WHEREAS, the Mason County Planning Commission with assistance from a consultant has prepared a draft Master Plan to revise and extend the Master Plan last adopted in 2006; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the public provided input into development of the draft Master Plan via one Town Meeting and through surveys at the start of the planning process and at meetings of Planning Commission since, and will have one more opportunity for public input at a public hearing and that draft documents will be available for inspection at the County Library and on the County website; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, the Mason County Planning Commission has held many meetings for careful review and refinement of the draft Plan and the revised Data Book, and at the County Planning Commission meeting on April 23rd adopted a motion recommending the County Board approve the release of the draft plan for public review and comment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners the County of Mason does hereby approve the draft Mason County Master Plan for formal public release, review, and comment pursuant to the requirements of the Planning Enabling Act.

<u>THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED</u>, that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Mason approves the attached base bid and alternates #1 and #2 from Tridonn Construction Company for various rehabilitation projects at the Mason County Jail; funds to come from the Jail Construction Fund; and

<u>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</u>, that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Mason directs the Board Chair to sign all necessary documents on their behalf.

After reading the resolution and receiving a second from Commissioner Carpenter, Chairman Lange asked Administrator Knizacky to update the County Board on the status of the bid. Administrator Knizacky reported that bids for the project were taken on May 31st with Tridonn Construction being the only bid. The Finance, Personnel and Rules Committee at the June 4, 2013 meeting recommended approval of the Tridonn Base Bid and Alternates 1 and 2 to the full County Board. On June 6th Architect Bill Roy received notice from Tridonn Construction there was an error on their bid and the cost of the stainless steel shower units was not included on the bid. The approximate cost for the shower units in the base bid was \$87,000 and the cost for the units in alternate #1 was an additional \$53,000. Tridonn Construction asked the county to reject the bid due to these errors. Administrator Knizacky recommended accepting the bid from Tridonn Construction as it was the only bid received and then asked Mr. Ross Falkowski of Tridonn Construction, who was in attendance, if that was an accurate account of what had happened and if he had anything to add on the issue.

Mr. Falkowski explained that there had indeed been an omission of the actual cost of the stainless steel shower units between his company and the subcontractor, there was a limited amount of sources for the stainless shower units which made securing pricing difficult, and that Tridonn Construction could not absorb the cost of the omission with a project this size. Mr. Falkowski stated that Tridonn Construction would need to withdraw the bid which would allow Mason County to receive his company's bid bond which would total approximately \$15,000 and leave the county in a position of seeking bids again which he felt would be substantially higher. Mr. Falkowski felt that his company, if allowed to change the subcontractor for that portion of the project, could get the cost of the base bid of the project closer to the original bid which would be best for the county financially.

Administrator Knizacky asked if the County Board was willing to allow him to work with Tridonn Construction and bring back any proposed agreement to the County Board for final approval. Chairman Lange moved that the resolution be amended to include allowing County Administrator Knizacky to work with Tridonn Construction regarding the omission of the cost of the stainless steel shower units for the jail renovation project and to bring any resolution back to the full County Board for approval. Commissioner Carpenter seconded the amendment and the motion carried with all members voting yes.

Treasurer Shirley Smith reviewed the May 2013 Treasurer's report, the Annual Investment Report, and the Tax Foreclosed Lands Summary Report.

Clerk Jim Riffle reviewed the May 2013 Clerk's Report and answered questions.

Administrator Knizacky reported that the campground project should be completed by July 4th if the materials needed to finish the project are not delayed. The tuckpointing at the courthouse has been started as has the Mason County Fairgrounds project.

Public comment:

• MSUE Educator Mike Crouch reported that Mason County is up and running with the "Step Forward Michigan" program which is designed to help homeowners who have fallen behind in paying their taxes or real estate payments.
