<u>WHEREAS</u>, Mason County has approximately 16.9% of its population between 18-64 not covered by health insurance based upon Michigan Department of Community Health, Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System data from 2006-11; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, approximately 1,600 adults between 18–64 in Mason County have an annual income under 133% of the poverty level and could be covered by the Healthy Michigan Plan if approved by Michigan's Legislature; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, without the expansion, approximately 2,132 Tencon Health Plan members in District Health Department #10 service area will have no coverage options at all because their income is below 100% of poverty, thus, by law, these individuals cannot buy subsidized coverage through the insurance exchange; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, individuals who have access to healthcare coverage miss fewer days of work, develop healthier lifestyles, and cost less when they get sick; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, opting out of the Medicaid Program expansion will continue to place an economic burden on hospitals and other health care providers who will not be reimbursed for services they may provide.

<u>THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED</u>, that in order to protect the health of all its citizens, especially those most in need, and to strive to improve the health outcomes of residents, the Mason County Board of Commissioners strongly urges the State of Michigan to participate in the passage of the Healthy Michigan Plan.
