

The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 9:00 a.m. in the Conference Room located in the Mason County Airport terminal 5300 W. US 10 Ludington, MI.

The meeting was called to order by Chair J. Andersen.

Invocation was given by S. Hull and Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America followed.

Reading of Correspondence: Chair Andersen read into the minutes a letter received from Dr. Kuster noting the Sheriff Department's breach of contract.

Public comments: Kathy Schindler, 206 First Street, Ludington, Mason-Lake Conservation District, noted that the annual Tree Sale is underway and she passed out a Mason-Lake Conservation District flyer.

Wally Cain, 919 Mitchell Street, Ludington, recently reappointed to the Council on Aging (COA), noted that he has reviewed what the COA has been working on the past fifteen months. He feels the County needs to do more and not to ignore the issues that have been brought before them.

John Cotten, Veteran's Officer, reviewed with the Board what has been done in 2022 for area veterans. Noted he has met all requirements for the Grant. As of February 3, 2023, he has met with 192 vets and/or spouses and assisted them. Questions were asked and he was thanked for his service.

WHEREAS, the association created the Michigan Counties Workers’ Compensation Fund in 1979 to help county members provide workplace safety and injury insurance services to its employees; and

WHEREAS, the association created the Michigan Association of Counties Service Corporation in 1986 to partner with service providers to help counties save money on everything from health insurance to telecommunications services; and

WHEREAS, the association hosts two major conferences every year to bring together county leaders for briefings on trending public policy issues and to hear from state newsmakers and others; and

WHEREAS, the association’s advocacy work in Lansing and beyond has advanced the interests of county governments and the residents they serve; and

WHEREAS, no fewer than five association presidents have served or are serving in the Michigan Legislature in the 21st century, a testament to the culture of public service inculcated by the association.

Treasurer Kmetz noted that his office will continue to be partnering with the Michigan State Housing Authority in 2023 and worked to assist 15 homeowners with back taxes totaling approximately \$37,000.00 in the 2022 calendar year. His office processed 59 Principal Residence Exemptions, of which 49 were denied and the one has appealed with the Michigan Tax Tribunal. Eighty-three parcels are at risk of foreclosure in March and the Treasurer plans to work with the owners.

Clerk Kelly noted the reports were previously emailed and she would answer any questions. She thanked the Board for their support of the APEX contract for vital documents. In addition to sending the Clerk’s report, she sent an overview of statistical information regarding public purchases from the Clerk’s office and the increases that were noted in CPL’s, as well as the continued uptick in criminal cases since 2018. The Board was informed of the upcoming May 2, 2023 Special Election involving Mason County Central Schools and Manistee Area Public Schools requests; and finally noted that three additional recall petitions were filed in the Clerk’s office regarding the Pere Marquette Charter Township Supervisor. The Clarity and Factual Hearing will be held on February 24, 2023 at 2 p.m. in the Commissioner’s Room at the Courthouse.

Administrator Knizacky posted the Emergency Manager’s position with only one response at this time. He will need to advertise for a small housing grant as FiveCap has stated they would administer this program on the County’s behalf. He informed the Board that they may start to see funds related to the OPOID lawsuit that the County was involved in. It was noted that restrictions will apply to the use of any funds the County receives.

Public comment: Randy Belair, Hamlin Township, noted that the Council on Aging intends on looking at twenty-five other counties not associated with the Area Agency on Aging to see how they function with regards to millage funds for seniors.

Mike Ingison-Mason County Road Commission, noted that the Road Commission is hoping to have a presence at all of the Board meetings. He is here to speak with anyone after the meeting if needed.

Other business: Chair Andersen noted that the Board needed to look into the Administrator’s position. Commissioners were provided with a Community Profile and job description. Significant discussion ensued with Board members regarding how they wished to proceed with filling this upcoming position. Discussion of hiring a consultant was entertained. Administrator Knizacky was asked to advertise with the following agencies: Michigan Township Association-MTA, Michigan Association of Counties-MAC, Michigan Municipal League-MML, and ICMA National. Administrator Knizacky suggested that the Board look at the candidates that apply and see what skill sets the individual would have to offer and address any areas after that time. Commissioners were asked to think of interview questions and provide them to Administrator Knizacky. Recommended was to place this topic on the May work session agenda.

Commissioner Squires noted that there is unfinished business that needs attention with regards to the Senior Directors and the Council on Aging, which needs resolution. Chair Andersen noted that the Council on Aging will be meeting Thursday and should have a robust discussion.

With no other business the meeting was adjourned at 10:39 AM.
