The regular meeting of the Mason County Board of Commissioners was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners Room located in the Mason County Courthouse in the City of Ludington.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman VanderWall.

Roll call was taken. Present: W. Taranko, B. Carpenter, C. Lange, C. VanderWall,

S. Hull, J. Andersen, T. Posma

Absent: None.

Invocation was given by Chairman Lange. Pledge to the flag followed.

Motion by T. Posma and seconded by J. Andersen to approve the agenda.

Motion by S. Hull and seconded by C. Lange to approve the minutes of the March 15, 2016 regular meeting. Motion carried.

Correspondence: No correspondence was read.

Public comments: There was no public comment.

Zoning and Building Director Mary Reilly reviewed the 2015 Building Department Report, Municipal Junk Authority Report, and the Planning and Zoning Department 2015 Annual Report. Director Reilly noted 2015 continued to be a good year county-wide with an increase in permits as well as revenue. New Energy Codes will be an added cost to new homeowners as required by state law. New Mason County Zoning Fieldperson Gene Dennert began his position with the County and Director Reilly thanked former Fieldperson Greg Bombeck for his service and wished him the best of luck in his retirement.

Equalization Director Tom Routhier presented the 2015 Equalization Report. The total State Equalized Value for the county is \$2,041,856,700.00 and the total Taxable Value is \$1,750,721,656. The overall state equalized value increased 3.61% and the taxable value increased 2.64%. Director Routhier recommended that the Board certify and accept the assessed values as determined by the local assessors and Boards of Review as the County Equalized Values (CEV). The CEV's are subject to review and change by the Michigan State Tax Commission. The preliminary State Equalization order will be issued May 9, 2016 and the final order issued May 23, 2016.

Commissioner Taranko reported on the upcoming changes that will affect the Ludington Coast Guard Station and its possible closing during the winter months. Modifications include: staffing from only May through September; ice rescues would respond from the Manistee Station and Traverse City air station with a 30 to 45 minute response time. The Traverse City helicopter is currently the primary response for ice rescues and would continue to do so under the proposed plan. Ludington, Manistee, and Frankfort are currently understaffed. The new plan would add additional staff. Future plans also include elimination of administrative staff, and increasing number of response personnel, as well as increased flexibility to cover leave times, sick times, or training/school absences. The 45 ft. boat out of Muskegon would be assigned to the Ludington port, increasing the capability for rough sea operations. The proposed changes are not considered a "done deal" as the Admiral will make the final decision this summer subject to any revisions. If the Admiral approves the plan, it will become effective October 2016.

Treasurer Kmetz presented the March 2016 Treasurer's Report and the 2015 Delinquent Tax Settlement Report. He noted the county purchased delinquent taxes from the townships for the tax year 2015 amounting to approximately \$2,946,000. Additionally, there will be 28 properties foreclosed on for 2016 year. A contributing factor to this higher number of parcels being foreclosed was possibly due to the loss of the Step Forward Program, which assisted tax payers with paying their property taxes if they qualified.

Clerk Kelly presented the March 2016 Clerk's Report. Filings continue to come into the Clerk's office for the various offices. Currently two positions are being contested: one involving the open seat for County Commissioner in District #4, and the race for County Clerk. Clerk Kelly wanted to let the County Board know that she spoke at Ludington Area High School in the Civics and Economics Classes of Mrs. Nasson and Mr. Schipper regarding education of the students on voting and what it entails. She is planning to continue and expand this project to assist the area high schools in educating students on voter registration.

Administrator Knizacky informed the Board on the following events: the bids for the jail roof project are due Tuesday, April 19th at 2:00 p.m.; the West Central Michigan County Alliance Meeting is scheduled for April 25th in Osceola County; the Mason County Township Officers Meeting is scheduled on April 21st in Meade Township; the upcoming audit by Layton & Richardson Accounting Firm is set for April 25th through 27th; a risk management audit performed by Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority was completed on April 11th; in conjunction with the Severe Weather Resolution, all County offices have been authorized to participate in a tornado drill scheduled for April 13th; and the upcoming Oakview Medical Care Facility meeting is scheduled for May 10th at 11: 30 a.m.

Public Comment:

• Evelyn Bergaila, Riverton Township, questioned the procedure on how Chairman VanderWall was running the meetings and felt when the Board was voting, that he was hurrying through the vote and discussion time and not allowing for proper time frame to ask questions or have discussion. She was concerned that the Commissioners follow the Robert's Rules of Order practices.

Commissioner Posma indicated to Ms. Bergaila that much of the discussion had taken place at the committee level meetings and these meetings are open to the public.

Administrator Knizacky stated he would follow up on procedural practices and address the issue.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned at 7:47 p.m.
